A member of the class of 2016, Mallory also holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Oakwood University, an HBCU located in Huntsville, Alabama.

Mallory has a love for premiering new works and has had the opportunity to work with several composers in creating new works for the harp. Offering masterclasses in harp composition, Mallory has appeared as a lecturer at Andrews University, The University of Texas at Austin, Oakwood University and several academies across the United States.

As an avid performer, Mallory has had the opportunity to be a member of the Omaha Area Youth Symphony, the Eastern Music Festival Orchestras, Oakwood University Symphony Orchestra, The University of Alabama Wind Ensemble, The University of Texas at Austin Wind Ensemble, Symphony Orchestra and Harp Ensemble, the Butler Opera Center, as well as the Austin Civic Orchestra. She has made appearances with the Laredo Philharmonic and the Valley Symphony Orchestra.
